

Pre-Licensing/Pre-Education Frequently Asked Questions

What is the most important application response concern? Be thorough and honest. Incorrect or incomplete response information can and does cause license applications to be denied.

What other application issue frequently creates problems? Failure to realize that the word ever means **EVER**. *(The exception is that subsequently expunged criminal history information does not need to be disclosed.)*

Will a criminal record keep me from being approved for an auctioneer or auction firm license? Possibly, but each application is reviewed on its own merits, and on a case-by-case basis. Further, any criminal history-based denial decision can only come following consideration and analysis of the factors listed in N.C.G.S. 93B-8.1 (b)(b1) and N.C.G.S. 85B-3.2(d).

I happen to have some criminal record issues in my past. Prior to beginning any education or sending in a license application, is there a way that I can learn if my particular situation will preclude me from being issued a license? YES. Information regarding a predetermination can be found at www.ncalb.org or by contacting NCALB staff.

Do I have to complete auctioneering school before seeking a predetermination decision from the Board? No. If you suspect that your criminal history may ultimately keep you from being approved for a license, you may want to request a predetermination decision from the Board prior to investing the time, energy, and expense involved in attending auction school.

Why does the application ask about financial matters? Upon being issued a license, auctioneers are permitted to assume the fiduciary duty of being trusted with the property (and proceeds from the sale of property) of their auction clients.

Will adverse financial information in my past preclude me from being approved for a license? Possibly. The Board assesses the past and current status of applicants and may deny licensure upon determination that a demonstrated lack of financial responsibility exists.

Do I have to provide a credit report? The Board may require a current credit report in certain circumstances, including bankruptcies, unsatisfied judgments, and worthless check criminal convictions.

Can I get a pre-determination decision regarding financial issues from the Board regarding financial issues prior to submitting a license application? No. North Carolina law requires occupational licensing boards to make criminal history-based predetermination decisions when requested, but not for any other reason.

If my application is not approved by the Board, is there any opportunity to appeal that decision? Yes. Any applicant whose license application has initially been denied has 30 days from the date of notification to request a formal administrative hearing before the Board. This is an opportunity to challenge information, present evidence, present witnesses, and offer testimony prior to the Board reaching any final agency decision.

PREDETERMINATION OF LICENSURE

An individual with a criminal history may petition a board at any time, including before an individual starts or completes any mandatory education or training requirements, for a predetermination of whether the individual's criminal history will likely disqualify the individual from obtaining a license.

For instructions on requesting a predetermination, please contact the office at (919) 567-2844 or email info@ncalb.org.

Pursuant to House Bill 770, which was ratified on June 28, 2019, Occupational Licensing Boards have the power to deny a license due to a criminal conviction pursuant to 93B-8.1(b)(b1). However, the following factors must be considered:

- (1) The level and seriousness of the crime.
- (2) The date of the crime.
- (3) The age of the person at the time of the crime.
- (4) The circumstances surrounding the commission of the crime, if known.
- (5) The nexus between the criminal conduct and the prospective duties of the applicant as a licensee.
- (6) The prison, jail, probation, parole, rehabilitation, and employment records of the applicant since the date the crime was committed.
- (6a) The completion of, or active participation in, rehabilitative drug or alcohol treatment.
- (6b) A Certification of Relief granted pursuant to NCGA 15A-173.2.
- (7) The subsequent commission of a crime by the applicant.
- (8) Any affidavits or other written documents, including character references.

MILITARY-TRAINED APPLICANTS/MILITARY SPOUSES

Licensure for military-trained applicants/military spouses: If you are a military spouse or a military-trained (applies for some types of occupational licenses) applicant you may be eligible for endorsement without meeting all of the requirements described in this application. APPLICATION FOR RECIPROCAL AUCTIONEER LICENSE

READ CAREFULLY all instructions in this application and the [North Carolina Auctioneer Laws, Rules and Regulations](#). Those are available on the Board's website at www.ncalb.org.

The application must be properly completed, signed, notarized, accompanied by all required documents, proper fees, and dated no more than **thirty (30) days** prior to when your application is received by the office of the North Carolina Auctioneer Licensing Board (NCALB). *It must be received, not postmarked, in the NCALB Office on, or before the deadline established by the Board.*

All fees may be combined in one check made payable to the North Carolina Auctioneer Licensing Board. The correct fees must be submitted. Please note that it is a violation of 21 NCAC 4B .0404 to submit a check to the Board in payment of required fees, which is returned unpaid.

Once the application is received and processed, the application fee is non-refundable.

FINGERPRINT RESULTS MUST BE RECEIVED BY THE NCALB PRIOR TO ANY LICENSE BEING ISSUED.

Required Application Documents:

- Required Fees. See Reciprocal Auctioneer License Application Instructions for details.
- Copy of applicant's high school diploma or proof of equivalency, college diploma or transcript from high school or college. You must be 18 years old and have graduated from high school or equivalent pursuant to N.C.G.S. 85B-4(b).
- A clear "2 x 2" photograph of the applicant's head and shoulders taken within the past 6 months.
- Fingerprint Card and Authority for Release of Information Form. See Reciprocal Auctioneer License Application Instructions for details.
- Written detailed statement for questions #14 through #20 if you answered "YES." **Complete details must be given. Attached a separate statement.**
- Designation of Agent for Service Of Process Form pursuant to N.C.G.S. 85B-5(b).
- Evidence of Qualification for reciprocity. **Third party reciprocity is not allowed.** See Reciprocal Auctioneer License Application Instructions for details.

Reciprocal Auctioneer License Application Instructions

Each ***applicant must carefully read and complete (Print clearly)*** the application in its entirety and provide the following supporting documents:

1. A clear, focused passport type photograph (2" x 2") of the applicant's head and shoulders, taken within the last six months, suitable for identification purposes.
2. Copy of the applicant's high school diploma or proof of equivalency. The NCALB will only accept a GED or high school diploma issued by accredited institutions. A college diploma, high school transcript or college transcript is acceptable.
3. Evidence of qualification for reciprocity: Each applicant must submit a letter of good standing (license status) from each Board/Commission where the applicant holds an active auctioneer license, including an auction firm license and/or an apprenticeship license, if applicable. **The applicant must reside in the state that they wish to reciprocate (no third party reciprocation).** This Board will accept an electronic letter of good standing if sent directly from that Reciprocate State's Board/Commission. Email address: info@ncalb.org.
4. Properly Completed Designation of Agent for Service of Process Form signed and notarized.
5. Fingerprint card, Fee, and Authority for Release of Information Form pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 85B-3.2; Each applicant is required to complete an **Authority for Release of Information Form, a fingerprint card, and pay the processing fee to this Board.** The applicant and the official taking the fingerprints must complete the card. ***The fingerprint lines/ridges must be clearly visible.***

8. Proper Filing Fees as required by N.C.G.S. 85B-6, which states that a reciprocal applicant be charged \$250, or the amount the applicant's home state charges reciprocal applicants from North Carolina, whichever is greater. As a result, applicants will be charged the following fees:
 - (a) Regular Reciprocal States : \$250 (\$50 application fee, \$150 license fee, \$50 recovery fund fee)
 - (b) Special Reciprocal States:

Please note the following for **AUCTION FIRM LICENSE REQUIREMENTS**

An “Auction Firm” is defined in N.C.G.S. § 85B-1(6) of the North Carolina Auctioneers Law. The requirements for auction firms are explained in N.C.G.S. § 85B-4.

Should you need a firm license in addition to your auctioneer’s license depends upon how you plan to operate your business. If you are uncertain, contact the NCALB office for guidance.

Sole Proprietorship: A licensed auctioneer who is the sole owner of an auction business is not required to obtain an auction firm license, but is required to personally supervise all auction sales, sign all contracts, and review all advertisements.

Partnership: Licensed auctioneers who are partners in an auction business are required to have an auction firm license, as are all other partnerships. This requirement includes partnerships involving spouses or other family members.

Corporation: All corporations are required to obtain an auction firm license.

Note: *If you are an applicant for a reciprocal auctioneer license and are working for a business that falls into one of the above categories needing a firm license, then that business must obtain an auction firm license prior to conducting business in this state.*

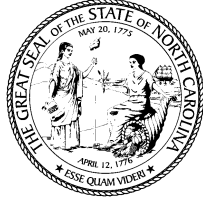
ESCROW ACCOUNT REQUIREMENTS

N.C.G.S. § 85B-7.1 Handling Clients Funds of the Auctioneers Law, and 21 NCAC 4B .0603 of the Rules and Regulations specifies the requirements concerning escrow accounts. Money, which has come into your possession through an auction sale, which is payable to the auctioneer or firm, and any portion that belongs to others, may not be commingled with your own under any circumstances N.C.G.S. § 85B-8(a)(7). In addition, such funds must be deposited in a trust or escrow account in a bank or savings and loan association **located in North Carolina**, within three business days of receiving the funds. Funds, which are disbursed to the seller on auction day, are not subject to the escrow account requirements; however, the Law and Rules specify certain record keeping requirements.

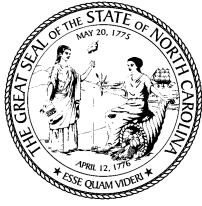
